

Bible Study – Isaiah 54:17

Subtitle: God’s Authority Over the Devil

—

1. Context of Isaiah 54

Isaiah 54 follows the powerful prophecy of the Suffering Servant in Isaiah 53. It is a chapter filled with restoration, covenant love, and divine protection. The final verse (Isaiah 54:17) is a declaration of victory over every enemy that rises up against God’s people.

The promise is made to Zion, representing God’s people, and speaks of their heritage as overcomers through God’s righteousness.

2. Original Hebrew Text and Translation

Isaiah 54:17 (Hebrew):

יִצְלַח לֹא עָלֶיךָ יוֹצֵר כָּל-כְּלִי

תַּרְשִׁיעִי לְמִשְׁפָּט אֱתָךְ תִּקְוִים וְכָל-לְשׁוֹן

יְהוָה עֲבָדֶי נִחְלַת זֹאת

יְהוָה נֶאֱמַר מֵאֵתִי וְצַדִּיקְתֶּם

Literal Translation:

“No weapon formed against you shall prosper, and every tongue that rises against you in judgment you shall condemn. This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord, and their righteousness is from Me,” declares the Lord.

3. Word and Grammar Insights

- “Weapon formed” – Refers to any strategic tool or device fashioned with the intent to harm or destroy you.
- “Shall not prosper” – It may form, but it will not succeed; God’s protection is greater than any weapon.

- “Tongue in judgment” – Indicates accusations, slander, or legal/hostile speech raised against God’s people.
 - “You shall condemn” – Hebrew: תַּרְשִׁי'וּ (tarshi’u), second person feminine singular. The one who condemns is YOU (the servant of the Lord). This shows that the believer is authorized by God to refute every accusation.
 - “Heritage” – A lasting inheritance, not a temporary blessing. It belongs to all who serve the Lord.
 - “Their righteousness is from Me” – Not based on human merit but on God’s righteousness given to His people.

4. God’s Authority Over the Devil

This verse reveals a profound truth: all demonic strategies, lies, and attacks are subject to God’s supreme authority. God not only promises protection but also transfers authority to His people.

- Satan is described as “the accuser of the brethren” (Revelation 12:10), but his accusations have no power when we stand in God’s righteousness.
- Believers overcome the enemy “by the blood of the Lamb and the word of their testimony” (Revelation 12:11).
- 2 Corinthians 5:21 affirms that we have become the righteousness of God in Christ, disarming the devil’s accusations.
- Jesus gave authority to His disciples over all the power of the enemy (Luke 10:19).

This verse is a declaration of divine legal authority. Every tongue—whether demonic or human—that rises in opposition will be silenced by the servant of the Lord through God’s delegated authority.

5. Application

- Stand firm in the Word of God when spiritual attacks arise.
 - Declare Isaiah 54:17 over your life in moments of accusation or opposition.
 - Live from the position of victory — not striving for it, but walking in it through Christ.
 - Remember your identity as a servant of the Lord, empowered and protected.

6. Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 8:33–34 – “Who shall bring a charge against God’s elect? It is God who justifies.”
- Isaiah 54:10 – “My covenant of peace shall not be removed,” says the Lord.
- 2 Corinthians 10:4–5 – “The weapons of our warfare are mighty in God...”
- Luke 10:19 – “I have given you authority... over all the power of the enemy.”
- Revelation 12:10–11 – The accuser is cast down, and believers overcome him.
